Corporate Spotlight: Humana Foundation



We are excited to partner with Humana Foundation to launch our Equitable Food Access Plan!

Dare to Care's team will spend the next three years ensuring that every aspect of what we do – from where our partners are located to the types of food we provide - serves our neighbors well.

That work will include listening closely to our neighbors' voices and experiences, advancing equity in our food bank and community, and ultimately eradicating food insecurity. Humana Foundation's three-year commitment totals \$1.8 million and aligns with its new focus on equitable health.

Partner Spotlight: Simpsonville Christian Church



Simpsonville Christian Church started its food distributions out of a closet under the stairs and has grown its operation to working out of several large rooms in their church. Its distribution advances equity in food access by operating a choice model and building relationships with those who visit its pantry. Providing neighbors a way to select their food offers dignity and autonomy, and choice models come in a variety of shapes and sizes: from grocery store-style shopping to being able to select some items in addition to the set food presentation.

Simpsonville Christian Church, for example, runs a drive-thru model, and neighbors select their items of choice from a weekly shopping list that is available in English and Spanish.
